

INFRASTRUCTURE



The electric grid runs along state highways in the UT. The expense of extending pole lines to remote areas confines most traditional development to fairly narrow corridors.

Though the Maritimes & Northeast Pipeline Project placed miles of conduit and associated equipment along the Stud Mill Road, the natural gas is not currently used in the UT.

The Northeast Reliability Interconnect (NRI) is a 345 kV electric transmission line proposed by Bangor Hydro from Bangor to New Brunswick that will also use the Stud Mill Road corridor.



This solid waste collection point on Route 9 in T 22 MD provides residents of 3 townships with an opportunity to dispose of household trash. The accompanying sign clearly states that other wastes such as white goods or demolition materials must not be left here.



Remoteness has its costs. Without convenient solid waste facilities, some people resort to "alternative" means of disposal such as target practice in this T32 MD gravel pit.
